The 70 posters on view are part of the Linen Hall Library's collection of more than 3,000 posters acquired since 1969. The exhibition opened on Saturday, February 5, 2005 and runs through March 20. The program series includes symposia, film screenings, author events for adults and children, and lectures and gallery talks throughout the six weeks that the exhibition will run.
