Each month the Shamrock News presents a poem by an Irish poet. This month we bring you a wonderful romantic old song by Padraic Colum. I remember my father singing this often in the evening back home in Armagh. And, it's not really as old as I thought. Padraic Colum was born Patrick McCormac Colm in County Longford in 1881, the son of a workhouse master. As a novelist, playwright, and poet he was a considerable figure in the Irish Literary Renaissance. As kids in Armagh in the 1950s we learned his poem, The Old Woman of the Roads. He married Mary Molly Maguire in 1912 and emigrated to New York two years later. He and his wife taught comparative literature at Columbia University from 1939 to 1956 and in 1958 Columbia honored him with a doctorate. He died in Enfield, Connecticut in 1972 and was buried in Sutton, County Dublin.
