### Ireland Bets the Farm!

On Tuesday September 30, Ireland took the extraordinary step of guaranteeing all the debt of its top six financial institutions. In one of the most ambitious measures undertaken by a government since the financial crisis began over a year ago, Ireland said that it would guarantee payments on as much as \$563 billion in bank debt, including securities, short-term borrowings and individual deposits without any limit. The (\$) figure, which the Irish government said guaranteed nearly its entire banking system, is twice the country's gross domestic product.

"We are in the eye of a storm...It's time for swift and decisive action," said Irish Finance Minister Brian Lenihan, warning other governments against allowing "catastrophic" bank failures. (from The Wall Street Journal, front page, October 1, 2008)

### **Poetry Corner**



Seamus Heaney (b. April 13, 1939 -- present)

Heaney was born at Mossbawn, about thirty miles northwest of Belfast, in Northern Ireland. He won the Nobel Prize for

Literature in 1995.

The Battle of Vinegar Hill was fought on June 21, 1798, between forces of the British Crown and the United Irishmen ("Croppies") when over 10,000 British soldiers launched an attack on Vinegar Hill outside Enniscorthy, Co. Wexford, the largest camp and headquarters of the Wexford Irish. It marked the turning point in the Irish Rebellion of 1798--the last attempt by the Wexford Irish to hold and defend their ground against the British military; it forced the Irish to fight "on the run" for the remainder of the Rebellion.

"Croppies" meant people with closely cropped hair; it was a derogatory nickname used by the British and applied to Irish rebels during the period of the 1798 Rebellion. (Wikipedia)
